## GCSE VISIT TO BRIGHTON BUDDHIST CENTRE

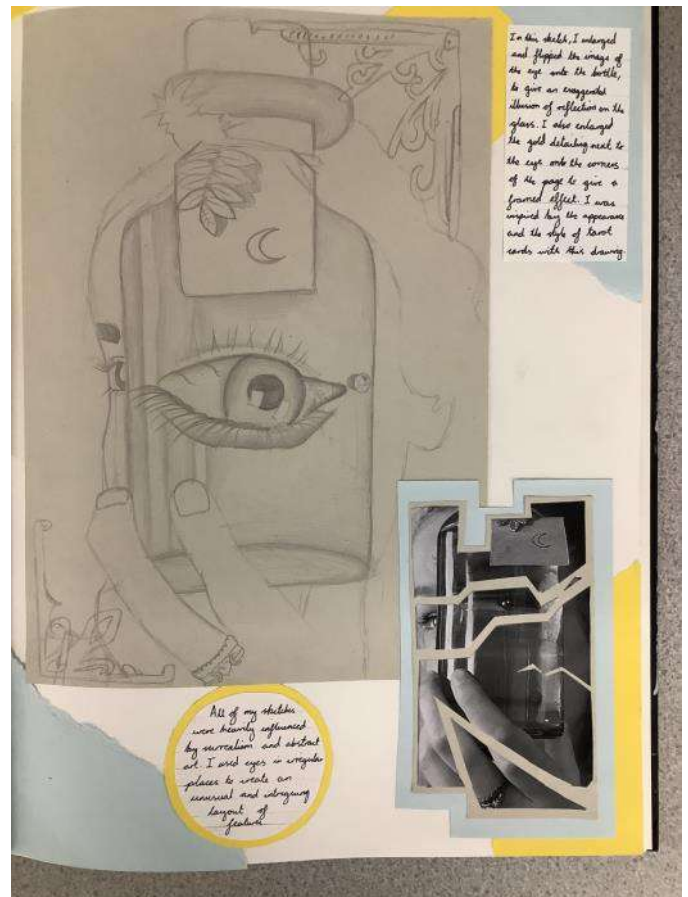
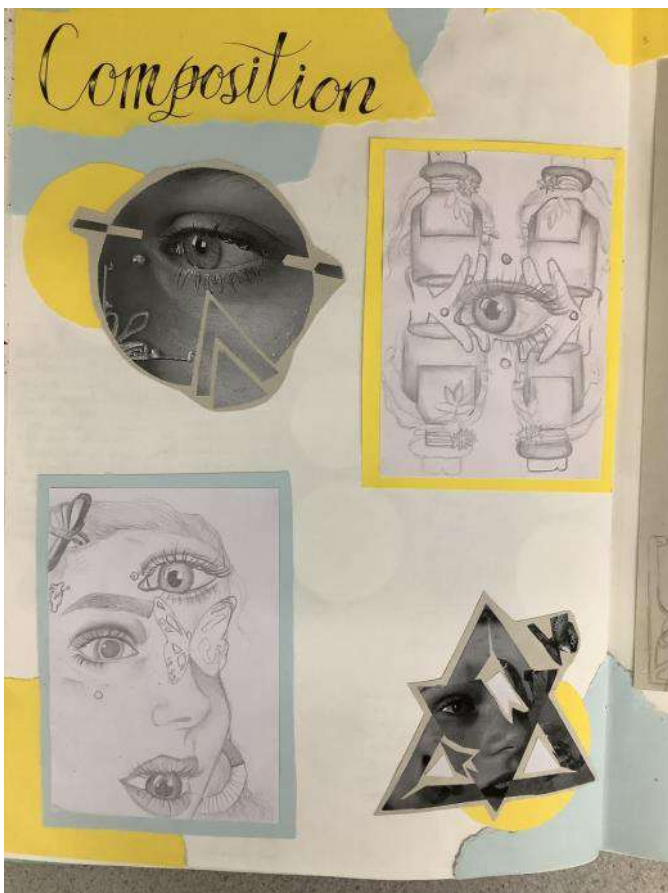
